


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From the **President**

Hall of Fame Inductee

Natalie DeLancey



Natalie DeLancey became the Executive Director of City Springs Theatre Company (CSTC) in 2021 after previously helping to form the company as the Managing Director beginning in 2017. She is responsible for overseeing overall operations, fundraising, and artistic vision for CSTC, including raising over \$2 million annually for the organization and serving roughly 50,000 patrons and students each season. Before City Springs Theatre Company, Natalie was the Director of Arts Education & Community Outreach for ArtsBridge Foundation, the arts education outreach arm of Cobb Energy Performing Arts Centre. Natalie managed four types of programs including: Field Trips, Master Classes, Family Performance Series & the Georgia High School Musical Theatre Awards – Shuler Hensley Awards. In addition, Natalie produced and directed the annual competition for the

Shuler Awards and she received the program's first-ever Southeast Regional Emmy Award for her 2017 Georgia High School Musical Theatre Awards production. Prior to ArtsBridge, Natalie served as the Artist Partnerships Manager at Young Audiences, Woodruff Arts Center. Before joining Woodruff, she served as the Manager on Duty at the Jennie T. Anderson Theatre in the Cobb County Civic Center complex. Natalie has a performance background in musical theatre and received a BA in Theatre & Performance Studies from Kennesaw State University's College of the Arts. Natalie was a member of Leadership Cobb's Class of 2016, selected for the inaugural 30 Under 30 program with the International Association of Venue Managers in 2015 and a member of the 2014 Arts Leaders of Metro Atlanta class. Natalie was also the recipient of the 2016 Ernest Barrett Award from the Cobb Chamber for her commitment to excellence.

Georgia Theatre Hall of Fame

The Georgia Theatre Hall of Fame, established by the Board of Directors of the Georgia Theatre Conference in 2008, recognizes exemplary contributions and accomplishments of theatre practitioners from, or working in the state of Georgia. The award is given at the discretion of the Board of Directors and may not be given every year. In 2016, the Board established a policy that no more than two candidates would be admitted to the Hall of Fame in a given year. R Lynn Wooddy Festival Winners

Many of us in the realm of Secondary School Theatre owe our thanks to longtime Dublin High School math teacher and Thespian Sponsor R. Lynn Wooddy. "Wooddy" was instrumental in growing Georgia Thespians, Georgia Theatre Conference, and the Georgia High School Association's one act lay competition. After he passed in 1993, the GTC Board of Directors renamed the award for the winning secondary play in his honor. When the organization moved to a split festival format in 2008, the title went to the 55-minute festival in recognition for his lifetime of dedicated service to theatre students across the state.

His 50-year affiliation with Northside High school in Warner Robins, combined with his leadership in Georgia Thespian, the Georgia Theatre Conference, and the Georgia High School Association earned him the title of the living legend of Northside High School. After Ray's passing in January, 2014, the Board of Directors voted to rename the 45-minute play festival he Ray Horne Secondary School Play Festival. Workshop Guide

Audition: College Auditions and Beyond, Mchael Karl Studio-Instructed by Jessie Brownie

"The Audition: College Auditions and Beyond" workshop equips high school students with essential audition techniques tailored to the competitive world of college and professional performing arts programs. Participants receive personalized coaching to refine their audition packages, ensuring they stand out in highly selective audition processes. The workshop also includes a comprehensive Q&A session, where students can ask industry professionals about the nuances of auditioning for top colleges, navigating callbacks, and transitioning from academic to professional stages

Auditioning for Theatre and Beyond, Instructed by Timothy Letheic Goins

This workshop will delve into the specific requirements and expectations of auditions for regional theaters, cruise lines, and theme parks worldwide. Attendees will learn how to select the right material, hone their performance skills, and present themselves effectively to casting directors in each of these unique entertainment environments. The session will also cover practical tips on navigating the audition process in different countries, including understanding cultural nuances and adapting to various performance styles.

Acting with Status, Andrew College—Instructed by Deborah Liss-Green

This workshop introduces actors and improvisers to the concept of Status, a powerful tool for creating dynamic characters and engaging scenes. Drawing on the pioneering work of Keith Johnstone, the creator of TheatreSports, participants will explore how shifts in status can instantly alter relationships and drive improvisational narratives. The hands-on, interactive format ensures that attendees leave with practical skills they can apply immediately in both improvisation and scripted performances.

Dungeons and Devising II: Heads and Tails, Berry College—Instructed by Peter Friedrich

Building on the foundations set in last year's "Dungeons & Devising" workshop, this sequel delves deeper into rapid, physical character development techniques designed to transform simple narratives into visually and emotionally compelling theatre. Participants will learn how to use their bodies expressively to make instant, impactful character choices that enhance storytelling and captivate audiences. The workshop will provide practical exercises that encourage improvisation and spontaneity, fostering an environment where participants can experiment with bold, theatrical choices that elevate the drama and intensity of any performance.

Mask Making with Air Dry Clay, Brenau University—Instructed by Pamela Workman & Danny Doyle

A mask-making workshop using air-dry clay, perfect for theatre enthusiasts and artists interested in exploring the world of character creation. This workshop offers a hands-on experience where participants will learn how to sculpt and design masks that can be used for performance or display. Guided by expert instructors, attendees will discover techniques for molding, detailing, and finishing their masks, with an emphasis on creativity and personalization. By the end of the workshop, participants will walk away with a unique, handcrafted mask and the skills to continue creating on their own.

Navigating Entertainment Technical Careers in the Oruise Industry, Camival Oruise Line—Instructed by Hannah Graham

Have you ever wondered what types of theatre entertainment technical jobs the cruise industry offers and how to get the job offer? During this workshop we will go inside the mind of the recruiters to learn how to tailor your resume, prepare for a skills assessment interview, and discuss the benefits of strategically aligning your coursework, internships, and summer employment in order to land the job. Discover the unique career opportunities the cruise industry has to offer!

Scenic Painting Techniques, Brenau University—Instructed by Larry Cook

A scenic painting technique workshop designed for both beginners and seasoned artists interested in enhancing their stagecraft skills. Participants will explore a range of painting techniques used in theatrical set design, including texturing, aging, and Icreating realistic scenic effects. The workshop will be hands-on, allowing attendees to practice these methods under the guidance of experienced professionals. By the end of the session, participants will have gained valuable insights and practical skills to elevate their scenic designs for the stage.

Stage Combat, Valdosta State University—Instructed by Ian Andersen

This dynamic workshop provides participants with a foundational understanding of stage combat, focusing on the key principles of safety and realism essential for effective theatrical fight scenes. Attendees will learn how to execute and react to punches, slaps, and falls, all while maintaining control and ensuring the safety of themselves and their scene partners. The workshop also emphasizes the importance of performance, teaching participants how to integrate these techniques into their characters to enhance the believability and intensity of onstage conflicts.

Tips for Handling Performance Nerves, LaGrange College—Instructed by Ellie Boykin

This workshop addresses the common challenges of anxiety and nerves that performers and designers face, particularly in the high-stakes moments before auditions and performances. It offers a set of physical movements, mental techniques, and strategic approaches tailored to help theatre artists channel their nervous energy into a focused and dynamic presentation. By practicing these methods, participants will learn how to maintain composure, harness their emotions positively, and enhance their performance quality under pressure, ensuring they can deliver their best work even in the most nerve-wracking situations.


